#### **COURSE PURPOSE**

The purpose of this course is to continue development of aural and sight-singing skills introduced in MUSI 1216 and MUSI 1217

#### **TEXTBOOK**

*Manual for Ear Training and Sight Singing, 2<sup>nd</sup> ed.*, by Gary S. Karpinski. W.W. Norton

#### **LEARNING OUTCOMES**

Upon successful completion of this course, students will:

- Apply a method of sight singing to more difficult tonal melodies, oral demonstration of complex rhythms
- Classify more difficult elements of music, including extended tertian chords, compound interval and non-diatonic scales
- Transcribe more complex rhythms and diatonic and non-diatonic melodies
- Transcribe and analyze diatonic and chromatic harmonies
- Read and reproduce rhythms in various meters, including syncopation and irregular beat divisions

#### **METHODS OF ASSESSMENT OF LEARNING OUTCOMES**

- Singing diatonic melodies and melodies with chromatic alterations
- Dictation
  - Rhythmic: All meters with emphasis on tied notes, dotted rhythms, and subdivision of the beat
  - Melodic: Diatonic with introduction of chromatically altered note
